Seniors protecting each other in extraordinary times

The timing was unbelievable....

Last fall when we prepared to roll out a new Friendly Caller program for seniors to counter social isolation and provide friendly checks, we had no idea how critical it would become. When we started calls in February, it may have seemed that we had foresight, but we'd actually been developing this before anyone heard of COVID-19.

Volunteers were easy to recruit!

Seniors were very interested in staying connected and involved in virus-safe ways. We soon realized that the key to this initiative was to organize it as two services: 1) a peer-to-peer program—with two seniors socializing with each other, and 2) a reassurance program with volunteer checks and reminders.

Peer-to-peer is working out great!

Everyone loves making a new friend, and phone friendships are a safe way to go these days.

Linda Conway, an RSVP member who volunteers at the Stevick Senior Center, heard about Friendly Calls and wanted to get involved. Linda was paired with a gentleman who has some similar interests. They chat twice a week on a regular schedule that suits them both. One of the perks of the program is that it's flexible to people's preferences and needs.

Linda shares, "Initially I wasn't sure if we'd have enough to talk about, but it's worked out because we share a variety of interests including music, health, history and current events. It's been really nice for me to meet someone new to talk about life experiences and share family stories during this time of limited social contact. I'm naturally chatty, but hopefully I've been a good listener too."

I'd like to learn more; what's involved?

Simply being willing to begin a new friendship by talking to another adult age 60+ once or twice a week for 15-20 minutes. Social interaction is always good; during this pandemic, it's fantastic!

You're eligible if you're age 60+ and a resident of Champaign County. Call the **Senior Resource Center** at **217-352-5100**; tell them you're interested in the Friendly Caller program.

What are the health benefits of social interaction?

Research has shown that social interaction improves your physical health, elevates your mood, increases self-confidence, and boosts your immunity. It makes you more interesting, and it's just the medicine for any senior or senior couple sheltering at home alone.

Reassurance calls give seniors peace of mind.
