AmeriCorps RSVP has partnered with the Sunshine Project and is asking RSVP Volunteers to come together and make Sunshine bags for pediatric hospitals
 around the country. The need is $100,000 \mathrm{bags}$, but with all of the RSVP volunteers throughout the country this is a goal that can be met. > RSVP Volunteerism \& what it means to the RSVP Volunteer and to the recipient(s) of RSVP Volunteers!


We at RSVP Champaign have many wonderful Volunteers and many wonderful stations of which they can Volunteer. One station stands out (and I may be a little biased as it's a station of which I am the Coordinator) and it's called Helen Stevick Food for Seniors. It has been delivering sacks of groceries twice a month to low-income seniors in the ChampaignUrbana area for over 33 years. Between 35-40 RSVP Volunteers turn up at the church around 6:30am in the morning and sack and then deliver nearly 200 sacks of groceries!!

In the past two years these volunteers have ALL gone beyond their Volunteer responsibilities owing to COVID. We realised very quickly that it was not just about the delivery of the food (which was and shall ALWAYS be our main goal) but it was making our senior clients feel safe about receiving groceries; being able to chat with the Volunteers, and generally feeling that we cared.

We started by checking in with ALL clients the day before the delivery to see how they were and reminding them of the next delivery; this was done by the Food for Seniors Delivery Driver Volunteers (a couple of the Delivery Volunteers had 30+ clients on their route)! A few of our Sackers decided that masks were needed for both the clients and their fellow Volunteers. We sent out the word to other RSVP Volunteers and it was amazing the response!! Overnight (well it felt that way) we had our first batch of masks made which was around 600-enough to give the Food for Seniors Clients 2 each for two deliveries and also enough for RSVP Volunteers. I want to interject here and say that one of the Food for Seniors Sackers made over 200 masks "herself"! As months passed our Volunteers kept up with their dedication to the clients. Noone complained, well not to me!!?

As Christmas 2020 was approaching one Food for Seniors Volunteer who owing to health reasons had to take a stand back from going to the church came up with a BRILLIANT idea!! We use brown sacks to
deliver our groceries. This Volunteer picked up 200 brown sacks and painted on every one of them a cute Rudolph Reindeer face on the front of the sacks!!! That just didn't make the clients smile but it made the Volunteers smile too. One RSVP Volunteer who now resides in a nursing home called us and asked if she could get Christmas Cards and write in all of them for the clients? YES, absolutely was our reply. Another batch of masks were also provided for Clients and Volunteers and of course a FULL SACK OF GROCERIES and a lot of warm smiles. By the way the Christmas in 2021 Christmas Cards were given/ written (by the same RSVP Volunteer) again, but instead of Reindeers on the sacks, 200 stockings were hand-made by RSVP Volunteers (some by the "Reindeer" Volunteer) and filled with candy, lip balm, hand sanitizer, night lights, and a calendar.

We are now 2 years into this COVID situation and there is a light at the end of the tunnel for both Food for Seniors Clients and Volunteers. My view of RSVP Volunteers whatever or wherever they volunteered in the past 2 years-!they saw a need and dealt with it! With a Smile! Food for thought (sorry about that pun!) In the year 202045 RSVP Volunteers Volunteered 3,047 hours for the Food for Seniors Program and in 2021 RSVP Volunteers Volunteered 3,650 hours for the Food for Seniors Program!!

The Food for Seniors Volunteers are like a family and when a Volunteer says something like this "Oh, I'm sorry I cannot come to the church next week, I need to take my [family member] to the hospital"! I reply "You have two families. Your own and the Food for Seniors Family. You concentrate on Your Family needs and your Food for Seniors Family will jump and help you out'! 'This really came into play when sadly we lost one of our Food for Senior Family members. She was a Delivery Driver and had done her route for around 7 years-17 individual addresses!! In less than 4 days 2 Food for Seniors Volunteers who presently do a delivery jumped in and said "We'll look after those clients'’!!

I could go on forever-but basically I wanted to share with you about RSVP VOLUNTEERS wherever they decide to Volunteer is a GREAT THING.
